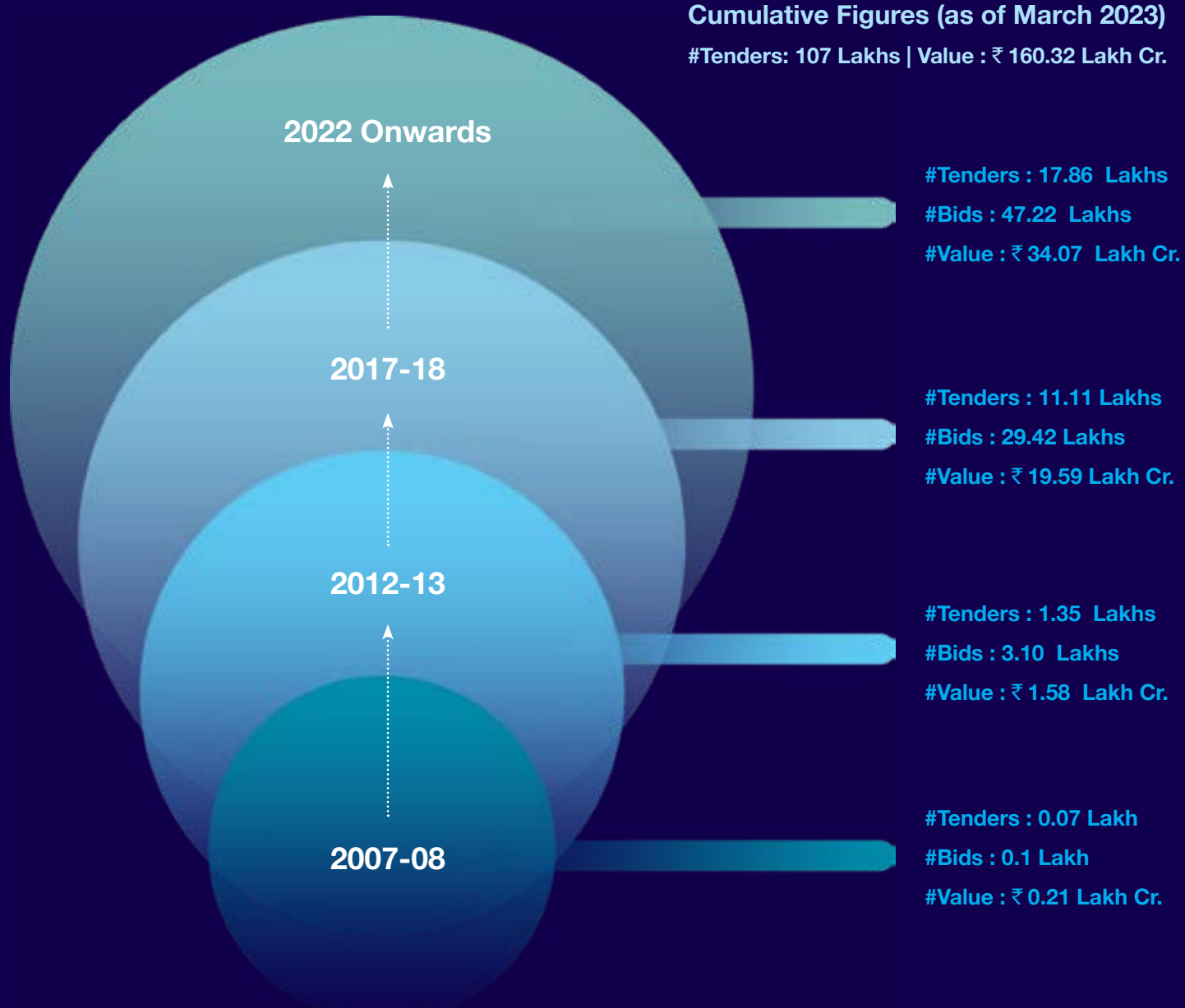

About

Central Public Procurement Portal

In pursuance of the recommendations of the Committee on Public Procurement headed by Vinod Dhall and the decisions thereon of the Group of Ministers constituted to consider measures to tackle corruption and ensure transparency, the Department of Expenditure has taken action for setting up a Central Public Procurement Portal (CPP Portal in 2012). National Informatics Centre (NIC) has been given the responsibility for setting up this portal.

The primary objective of the portal is to provide a single point access to all the information on procurements made across various Ministries and the line Departments.

Tender information from all State/Union Territories, Central Government entities, Central Public Sector undertakings and Government eMarket Place are made available on a real time basis. The CPP Portal is accessible at the URL <http://eprocure.gov.in> and it has e-publishing and e-procurement modules.

Active tenders, Corrigendum, Bid Awards, across States/UTs, Central Government, CPSEs, Vendor Debarment information, Global tenders, High value tenders, Grievance/Suggestion capture, Monthly Newsletters, Capacity building programme schedule, are made available.

Background

National Informatics Centre (NIC), Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology, in close association with **Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance** has developed, hosted and implemented the Central Public Procurement. The core engine behind the CPP Portal is the Government eProcurement system of NIC, GePNIC®. The system is made available as a platform and can easily be adopted for all kinds of procurement such as Goods, Services & Works. It aims at

transparency and non-discrimination amongst bidders, by allowing free access to tender documents, clarifications, secure online bid submission and access to bid opening event to all, from any place on 24x7 basis, using the system through Internet, in a faster, and secure environment adopting industry standard open technologies. Wide range of procurement requirements of various procuring entities has been built in a robust configurable, workflow-based manner. This can be configured for use

by an organization at its apex level, and at multiple subordinate levels, at which tenders could independently be floated.

Strong in-built security features including two-factor Authentication with Digital Signature Certificates (DSCs) for foreign nationals also as per IT Act, Usage of SSL, Role-based User Access and Bid-encryption at Client end, using PKI technologies. Security audited by as per EPS guidelines by STQC.

User base across the country by 31 State / Union Territories of India and by more than 700 Central Govt. entities. Processed 102 Lakh electronic tenders worth over Rs. 152.68 Lakh Cr. have been processed successfully till 31st March 2023.

The platform has also facilitated processing of around 5,000 average Global tenders per month with multi currency and Tenders of multilateral Bank funded projects as well.

Purpose & Audience

This annual report on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) based on the usage in the year 2022-23. The target audience of this report would be all users of Central Public Procurement Portal, Policy makers, key decision makers, Procurement officials or researchers who are involved in Government procurement. The purpose of the report is to showcase achievements of electronic procurement through CPP Portal across the country by

various Central procuring entities, Autonomous Body, State Government, Union Territories and Public Sector Unit(s) during this financial year. This annual report provides information on statistical reports and summarizes and compares statistics with the past year on a set of performance indicators. It shows the trends of growth, comparative analysis and other variations. Annual report carries the highlights Electronic Procurement Workshop held and the

abouts the exchange of ideas. In addition, the functional enhancements made in the portal for benefit of users are also highlighted. A separate section on auctions conducted for Gift items presented to Hon'ble Prime minister is also included.

This report exemplifies the importance of use electronic systems for procurement and highlights its benefits. This year

procurement worth Rs. 34.07 Lakh Crores were accomplished with a cumulative fig of 17.86 Lakh tenders processed in the year April 2022 - March 2023 which is almost the same as previous year, if not higher. Bidder based stood at a cumulative figure of 6 Lakhs and Department officials to 4.78 Lakhs. Phenomenal number of 47.61 Lakh bids were received during this period of 2022-2023.

Lessons Learnt & Challenges Addressed

Policy : No Central legal framework available for the country which governs procurement processes, Few States have enacted State specific Transparency in public procurement Act but majorly governed by Executive Directives. One of the major challenges was of evolving a generic approach for the perceived common solution for implementing electronic Tendering, from among diverse procurement processes, procedures and formats followed by different Government agencies/ departments.

Leadership and Governance : Ownership of e-Procurement system and implementation within the organization. It was seen that on many occasions IT people were assigned this task who had little knowledge or say in the procurement process. NIC has assisted all such people with full support and continuous hand holding to enable adoption of electronic system.

Process : Process Reengineering, Emulating Best Practises, Adoption of Standard Bidding Document, Standardisation of Price Bid templates, Standard directories on bidders, products, and locations.

Infrastructure : Availability of front end computer systems with necessary network

connectivity, accessories and power backup facility for teams to operate, Back end systems with necessary capacity to meet the user requirements.

Technology and Tools : Easy availability of Digital Signature Certificates and necessary tools. National Informatics Centre Certifying Authority (NICCA) with its offices across the country stepped in by issuing Digital Signature Certificates across the country for most of the procuring entity officials.

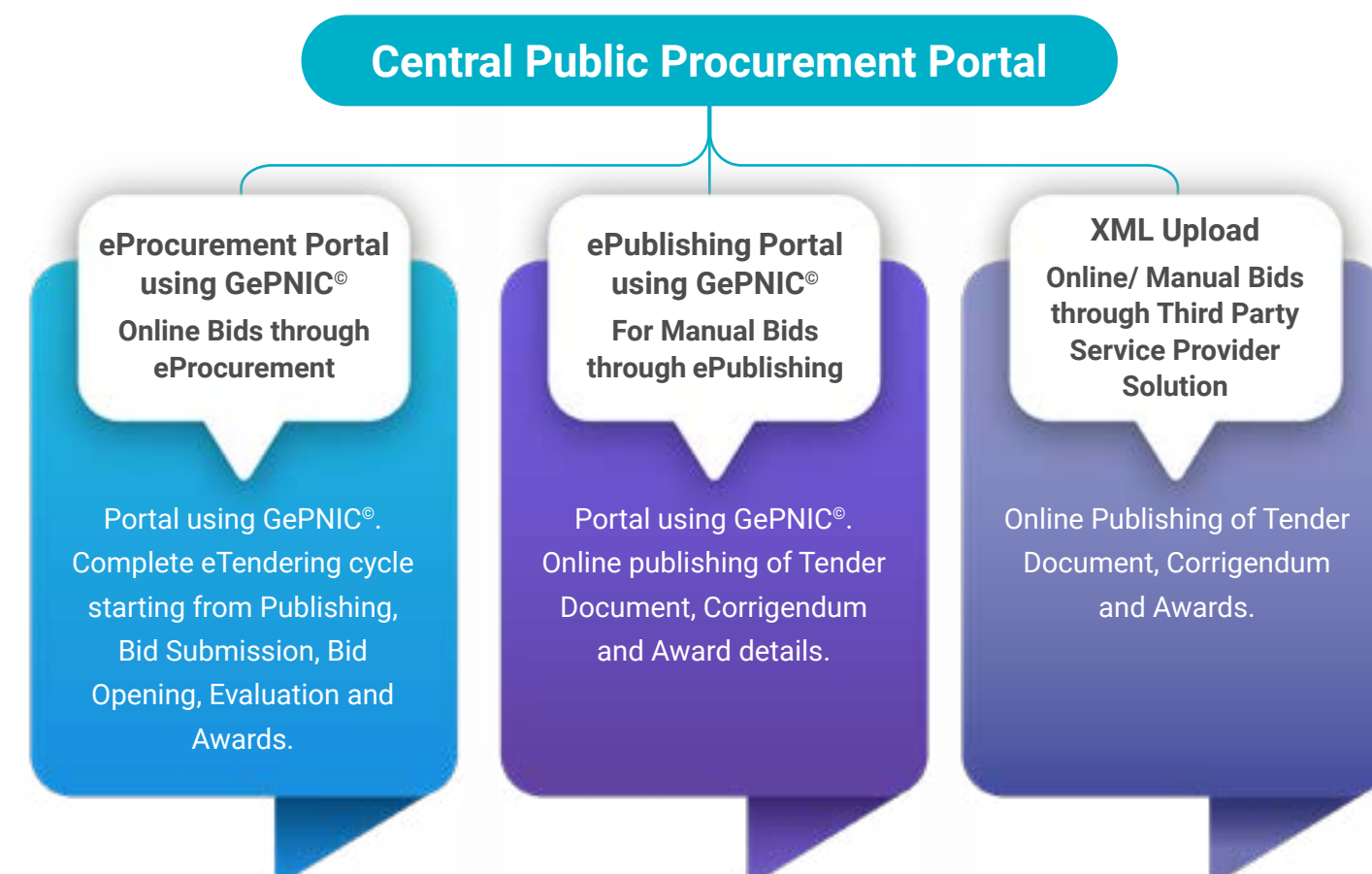
Fear of adoption : Change in the mindset of employees to adopt electronic tendering by highlighting its benefits.

Capacity Building (People) : As we move across the IT awareness and technology adoption also varied from place to place. A plethora of our bidder community in the far flanged areas of the country did not possess necessary IT skills and knowledge. Extensive capacity building measures like PMUs, Help desk, email support have enabled fade this divide over a period of time.

Central Public Procurement Portal

Assimilation of all tenders across the country : One stop shop for all activities for all GOI Policies/ Standards/ Guidelines / Orders, etc. on public procurement.

Mandatory for all Ministries/ Department of the Central Government, their attached and subordinate offices, Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and autonomous/ statutory bodies to make their tenders enquires available in Central public procurement Portal. Various methodology of same is as follows:

Journey so Far

Central Public Procurement Portal was made operational on 1st January, 2012 by providing a two phased model for seamlessly brining in all Central Government entities into electronic procurement ambit - ePublishing and eProcurement.

The seed for GePNIC® was sown way back in 2005-2006 when NIC wanted to adopt online tendering for its own requirements. We, at NIC have modest procurement requirements and process about 100+ tenders a year, predominantly of IT equipment and Services. But in a well thought move, in 2005, NIC planned to extend it to other procuring organizations. We experimented with readily available systems provided by third party by customizing it to suit the requirements of government. However, this exercise couldn't be sustained. That's when we realized that if we need to serve various government departments, we would need to carve out a solution of our own i.e., we needed to be Atmanirbhar.

NIC took up the challenge to provide an eco-system which could emulate the complete existing procurement process without any

compromise on procedures and practices followed, but by bringing in re-engineered process with more security, enhanced transparency and undoubted authenticity. Thus, was born a generic e-Procurement software system, viz. Government eProcurement System of National Informatics Centre, GePNIC®. It was developed in house to cater to the procurement / tendering requirements of the Government departments and organizations. The system can easily be adopted for all kinds of procurement activities such as Goods, Services & Works.

By issuing various guidelines and with constant monitoring, Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure has successfully on boarded majority of Central government procuring entities on to the portal. Multiple channels of Capacity Building, Easy availability of Digital Signature Certificates, Process re-engineering as per need, inculcating the adoption of Best Practices across organization, availability of uniform platform for ease of use and quick adoption in case of interdepartmental transfers etc. were the steps taken which resulted in multifold increase growth over the last few years across the country.

Central Public Procurement Portal

As per Government Financial Rules (GFR 2017)

The Transparency Principle which is one of the fundamental principles of public procurement as per General Financial Rules, 2017 (Rule 144) states that 'all procuring entities should ensure that offers should be invited following a fair and transparent procedure and also ensure publication of all relevant information on the Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP). Central Public Procurement Portal

(CPPP) has been designed, developed and hosted by National Informatics Centre (NIC, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology) in association with the Dept. of Expenditure to ensure transparency in the public procurement process. The primary objective of the Central Public Procurement portal is to provide single-point access to the information on procurements made across various Ministries and Departments.

ePublishing (GFR - Rule 159)

It is mandatory for all Ministries/Departments of the Central Government, their attached and Subordinate Offices and Autonomous /Statutory Bodies, to publish their tender enquiries (including advertised/limited/single tender enquiries), corrigenda thereon and details of bid awards on the Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP). E-Publishing has dispensed with print-advertisements in Newspaper etc.

Exemption : Individual cases where confidentiality is required, for reasons of national security, would be exempted from the mandatory e-publishing requirement. These instructions also would not apply to procurements made in terms of Purchase of goods without quotations/ Purchase of goods by purchase committee.

eProcurement (GFR - Rule 160)

It is mandatory for Ministries/Departments to receive all bids through e-procurement portals in respect of all procurements. Ministries/Departments which do not have a large volume of procurement or carry out procurements required only for day-to-day running of offices and also have not initiated e-procurement through any other solution provided so far, may use e-procurement solution (CPPP) developed by NIC. Other Ministries/Departments may either use e-procurement solution developed by NIC or engage any other service provider following due process.

Exemption : In individual case where national security and strategic considerations demands confidentiality, Ministries/Departments may exempt such cases from e-procurement. Also, Competent Authority may exempt in case of tenders floated by Indian Missions Abroad (global tender).

Advertised /Open Tender Enquiry (GFR - Rule 161)

Invitation to tenders by advertisement (open tender) should be given on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) at www.eprocure.gov.in and on GeM. An organisation having its own web site should also publish all its advertised tender enquiries on the web site. The Procuring Entity should also post the complete bidding document in its web site and on CPPP to enable prospective bidders to make use of the document by downloading from the website.

Registration of Suppliers (Rule 150)

Registration (Simply registering the contractor, without any verification)-All the Ministries/Departments shall register the prospective contractors on their e-procurement portal or in the CPPP (in case they do not have their own e-procurement portal) before submitting their bids.

Identification of likely sources for consulting services (GFR - Rule 183 ii)

Where the estimated cost of the consulting services is above Rupees twenty-five lakhs, in addition to Rule 183 (i), an enquiry for seeking 'Expression of Interest' from consultants should be published on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) at www.eprocure.gov.in and on GeM. An organisation having its own website should also publish all its advertised tender enquiries on the website.

Global Tender enquiry (GTE)

As per manual for procurement of goods 2017 is similar to OTE but, through appropriate advertising and provision for payment in Foreign Currencies through Letter of Credit, it is aimed at inviting the participation of inter-alia foreign firms. Advertisement in such cases should be given on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP).

Limited Tender Enquiry (GFR - Rule 162)

An organisation should publish its limited tender enquiries on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) as per Rule 159. Apart from CPPP, the organisations should publish the tender enquiries on Department's or Ministry's website.

As per manual for procurement of goods 2017, certain items are procured only from Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) or manufacturers having proprietary rights (or their authorised dealers/stockists) against a Proprietary Article certificate. Even in PAC procurements the NIT and the Award of Contract should be put on the website of CPPP and Procuring Entity.

Transparency, competition, fairness and elimination of arbitrariness in the procurement process (GFR-Rule 173 (xviii))

The name of the successful bidder awarded the contract should be mentioned in the CPPP, Ministries or Departments website and their notice board or bulletin.

New Features Added

Introduction of eAgreement

The system has the provision for tender evaluator to generate eAgreement and request to Sign the agreement once the tender completes Financial Evaluation and before the Award of Contract. Evaluator defines the period for submission of the eAgreement. Once the eAgreement is requested the bidder downloads the agreement template after the Submission start date is crossed and uploads the signed document. Once the Agreement submission period is completed, the Tender Evaluator downloads the submitted agreement and can accept/ request to resubmit the eAgreement if it is not found in order.

Pre Tender Integration as a Service

Pre-Tender Integration process has been introduced for passing the meta data of the tender from the department SAP/ERP system to the GePNIC© portal through web services. The metadata is encrypted and digitally signed by the department user and then the data is pushed to GePNIC© portal using API (RESTful) services in an pre-agreed electronic message format. The process of automatically pushing the tender metadata and Documents like basic documents (NIT, DNIT, SBD etc.) and work Item documents (BoQ, Additional documents and other documents) generated in the SAP/ERP system to GePNIC© portal by using API(RESTful) is the pre-tender integration process.

Purchase Preference for Preferential and Domestic Bidders

A provision has been made in the system to give purchase preference to preferential and domestic bidders in case of procurement of Goods or services, where it is possible for the procuring entity to divide the award of tenders to more than one supplier or service provider. Bidders who have enrolled themselves as preferential bidders like MSME, Startup, Make-in-India, State PSUs, SC/ST Entrepreneur etc., are considered. During bid submission, system facilitates the bidder to avail Preferential Bidder option and upload & digitally sign the preference document. Purchase preference is given while awarding the contract as per the preferential category norms defined by the Government.

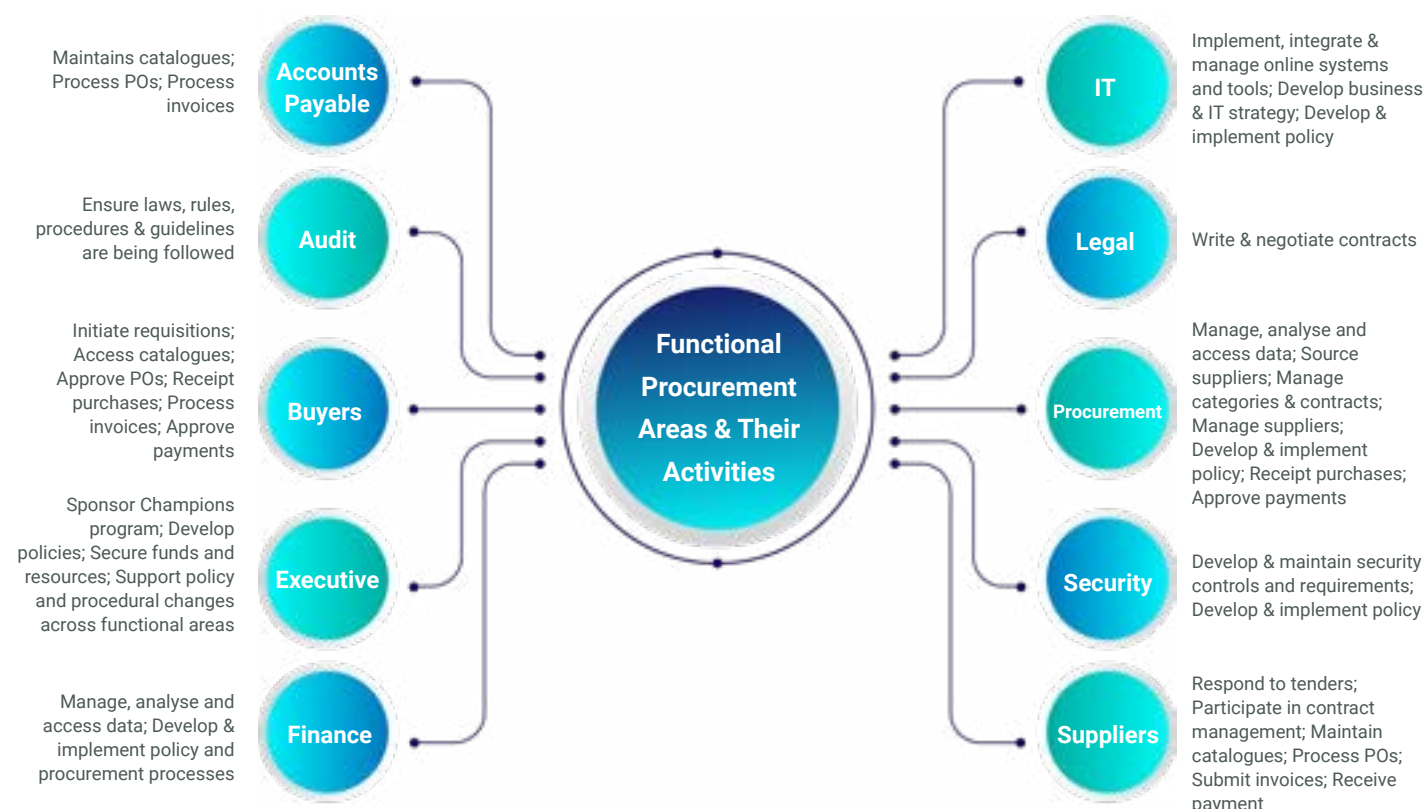

Stakeholder identification

Stakeholders for e-procurement can include any person or functional area that “touches” the systems, tools or information being held. This may include people at all levels of the organisation and external contacts such as suppliers and

outsourcing partners. The following list provides a general view of functional procurement areas and their potential e-procurement - related activities.



Managing Stakeholders

When managing suppliers, it is important to demonstrate the benefits of e-procurement as their engagement is critical to success. Communicate what e-procurement can and cannot do followed - up with regular progress reporting and quantifiable metrics. These messages, form part of a strong Communications Plan and will help to keep key stakeholders informed and manage their expectations.

Getting stakeholders to participate can be difficult, especially if they do not understand the value of the implementation to themselves and their functional area. A successful model includes a cross - functional team with members from each functional area (see list detailed in Stakeholder Identification). The team can support testing, development and training activities along with acting as product champions.

Key stakeholders are made aware of all version releases by informing them at least a a month in advance by sharing a version control document.

A demo server is in place wherein all the new changes a redeployed. trainings and webinars are held for stakeholders to check and give their feedback.

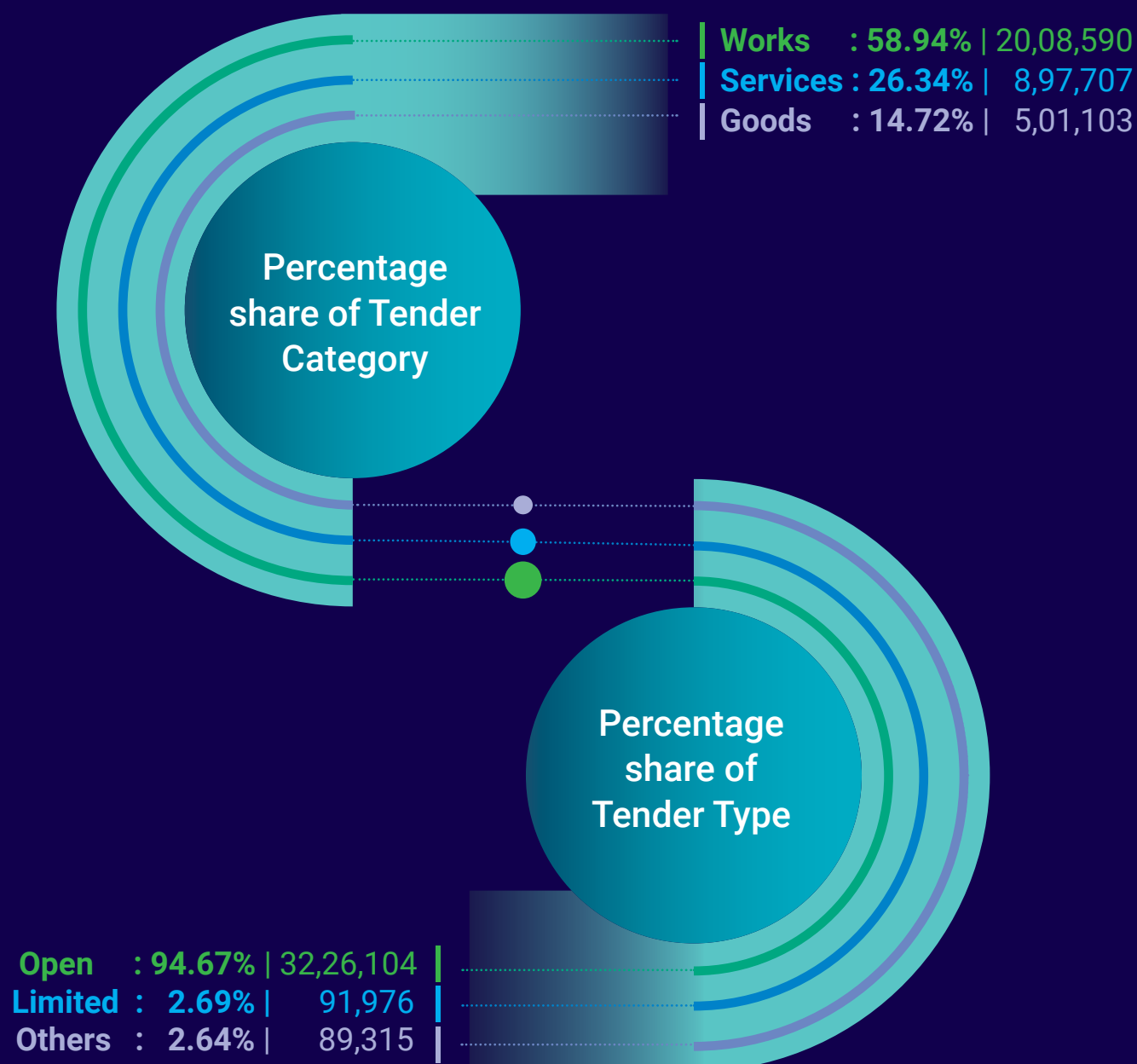
Once approved, new version is released gradually amongst the 48 live instances. It is also ensured that new version release does not impact ongoing tenders.

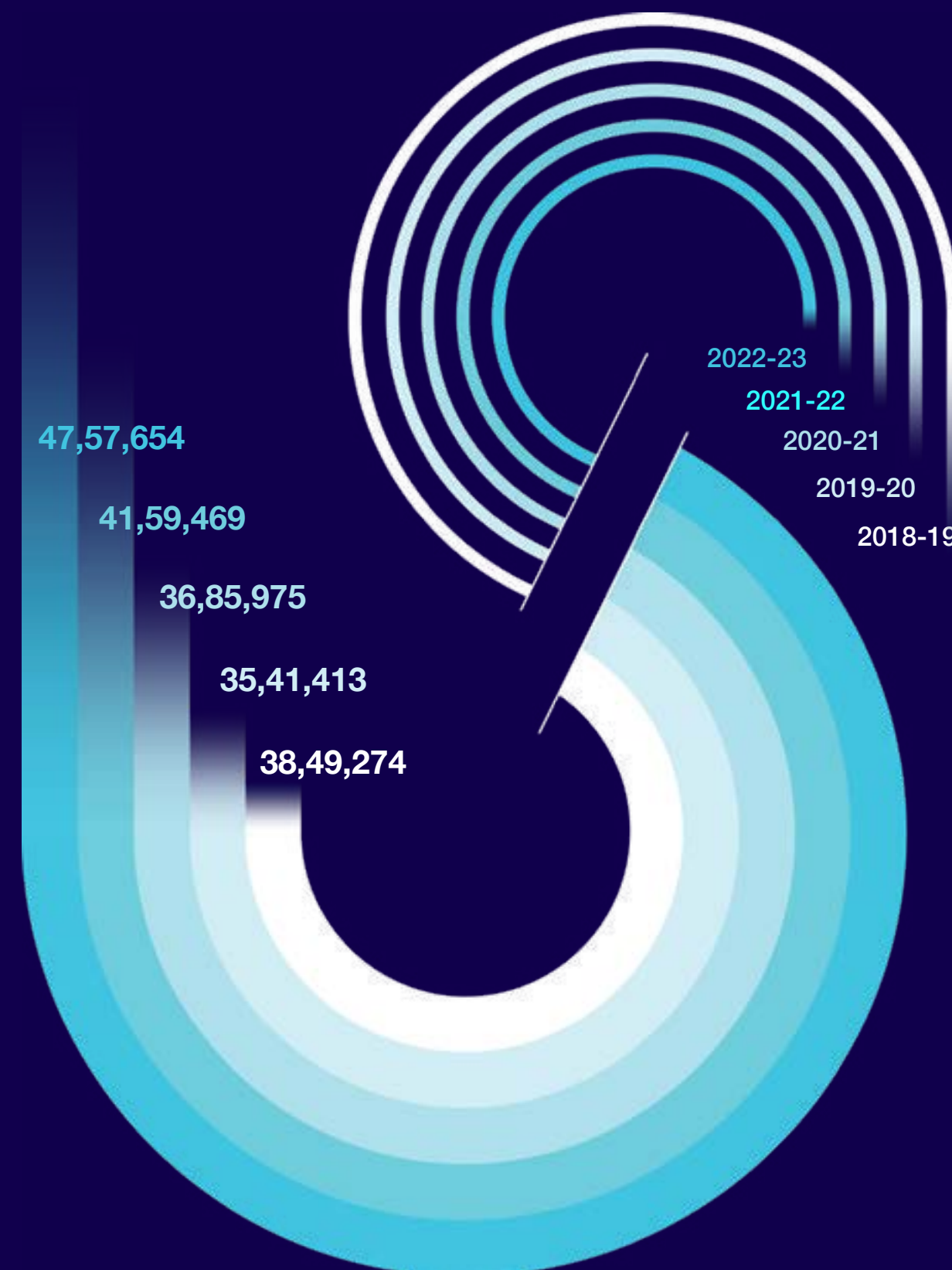

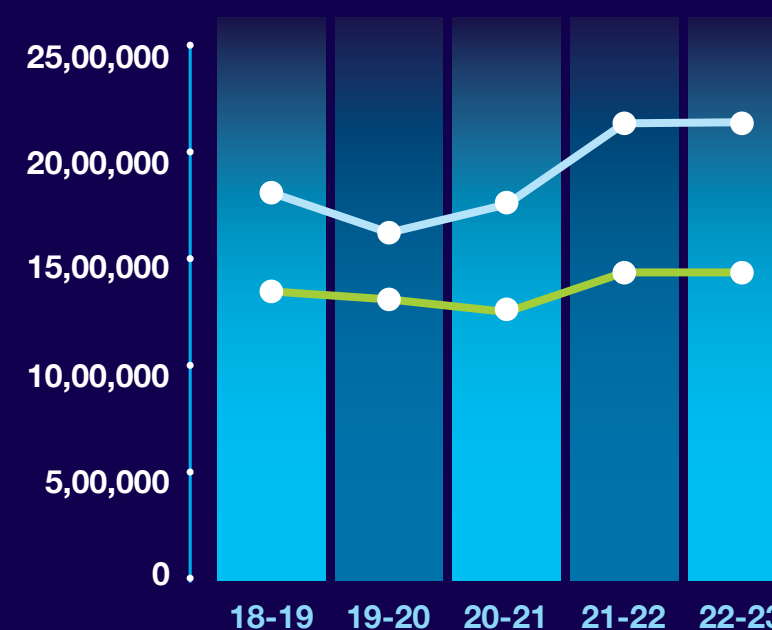

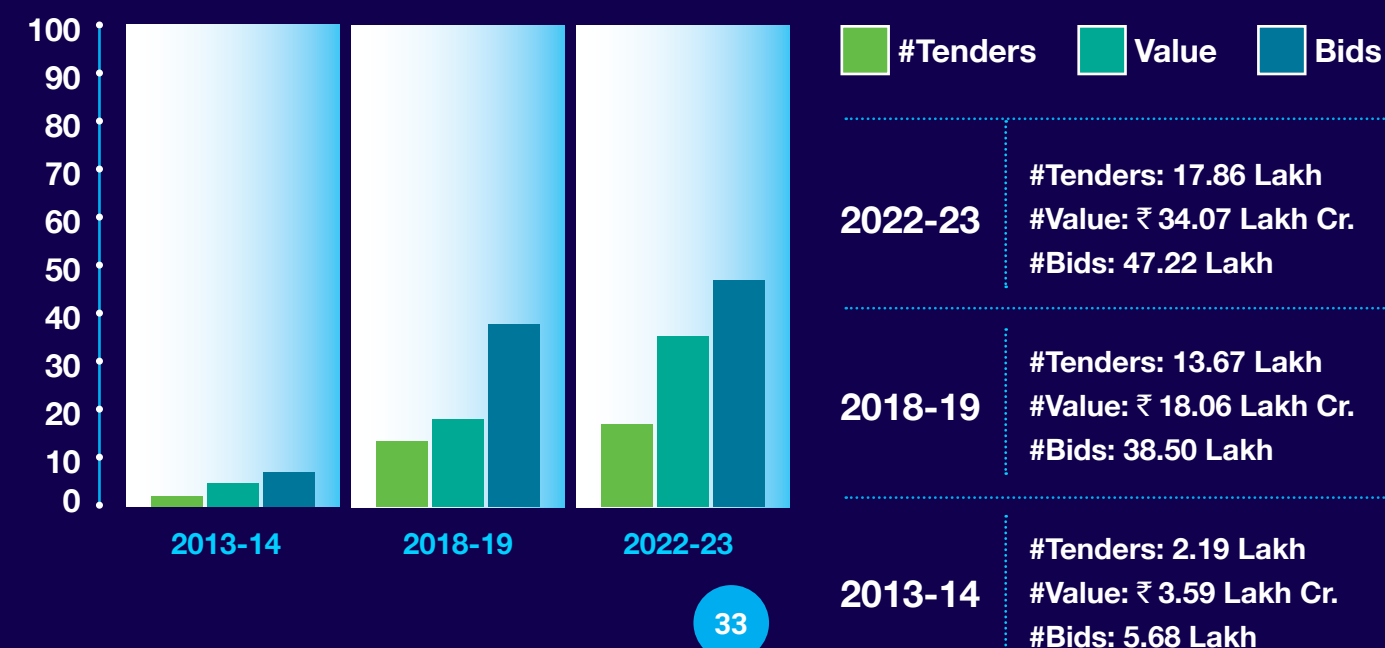

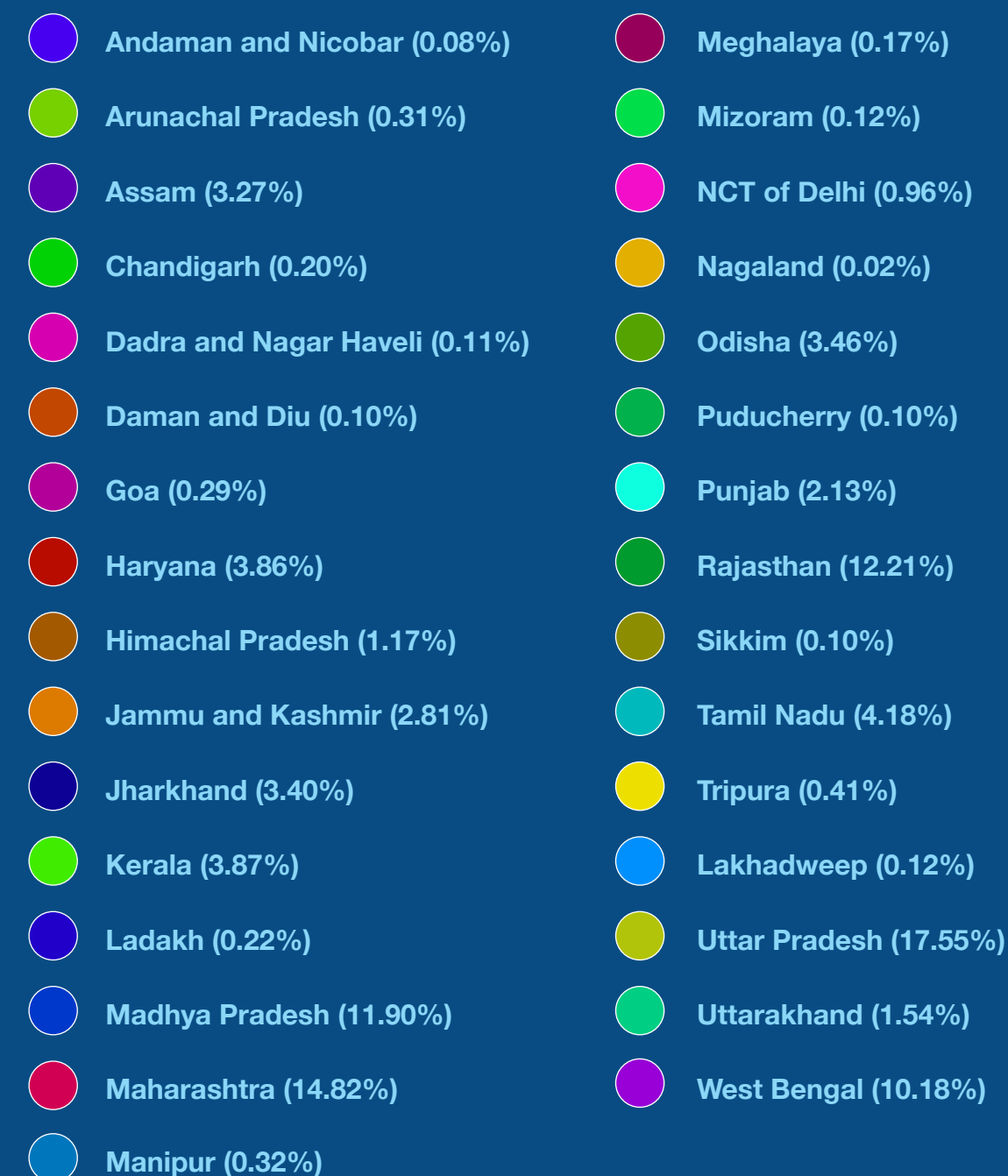
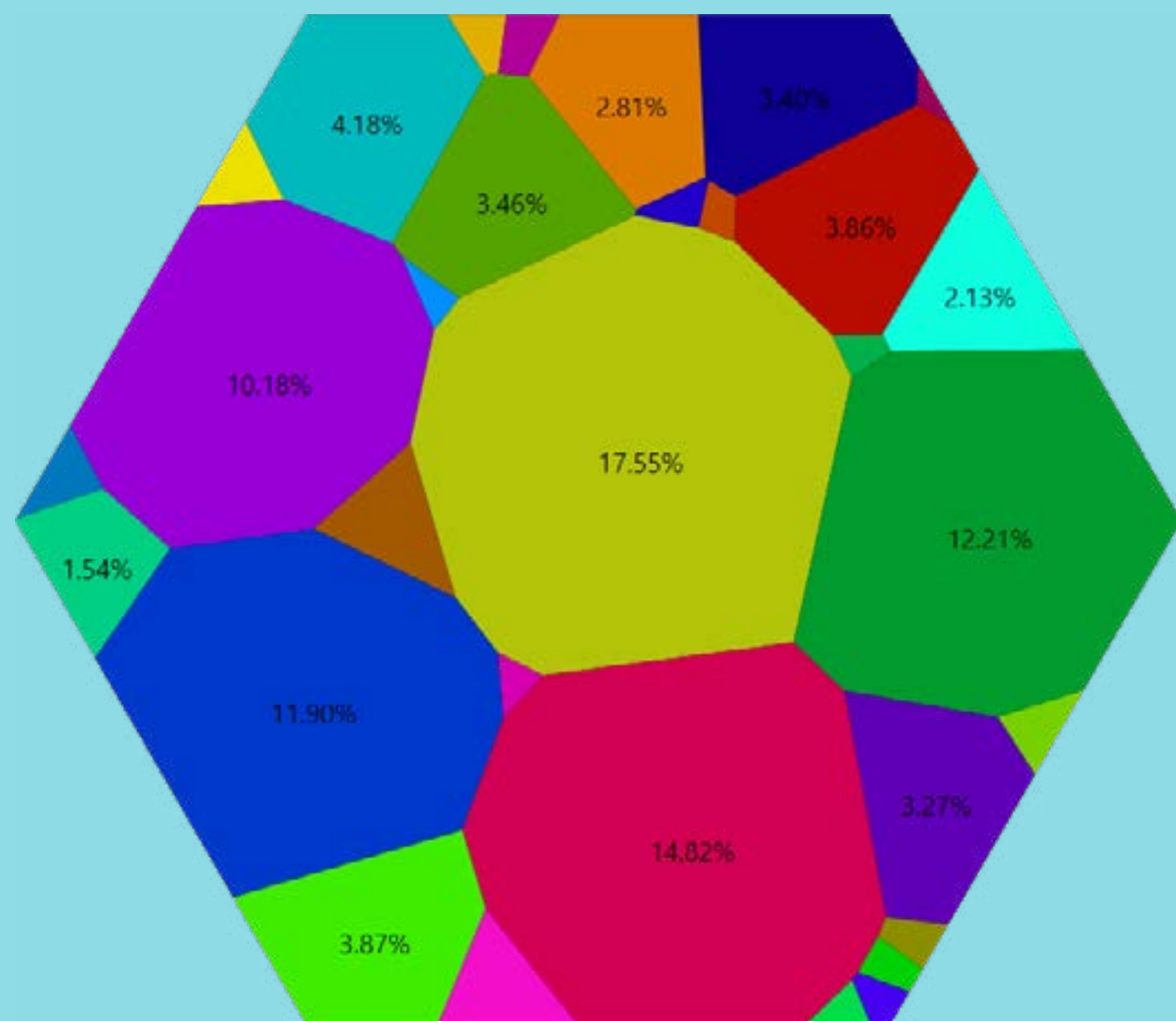

Growth over last two Lustrum

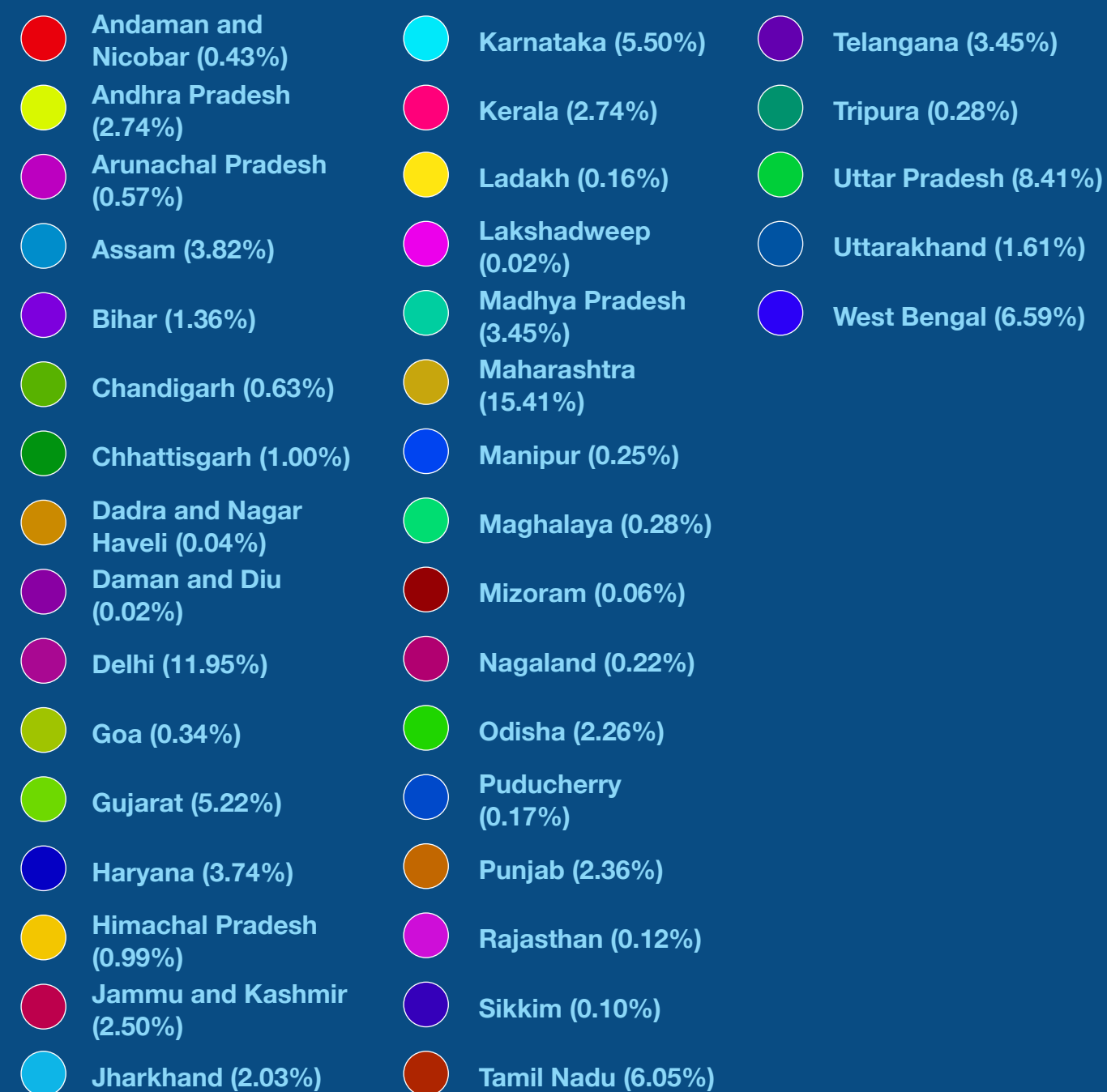
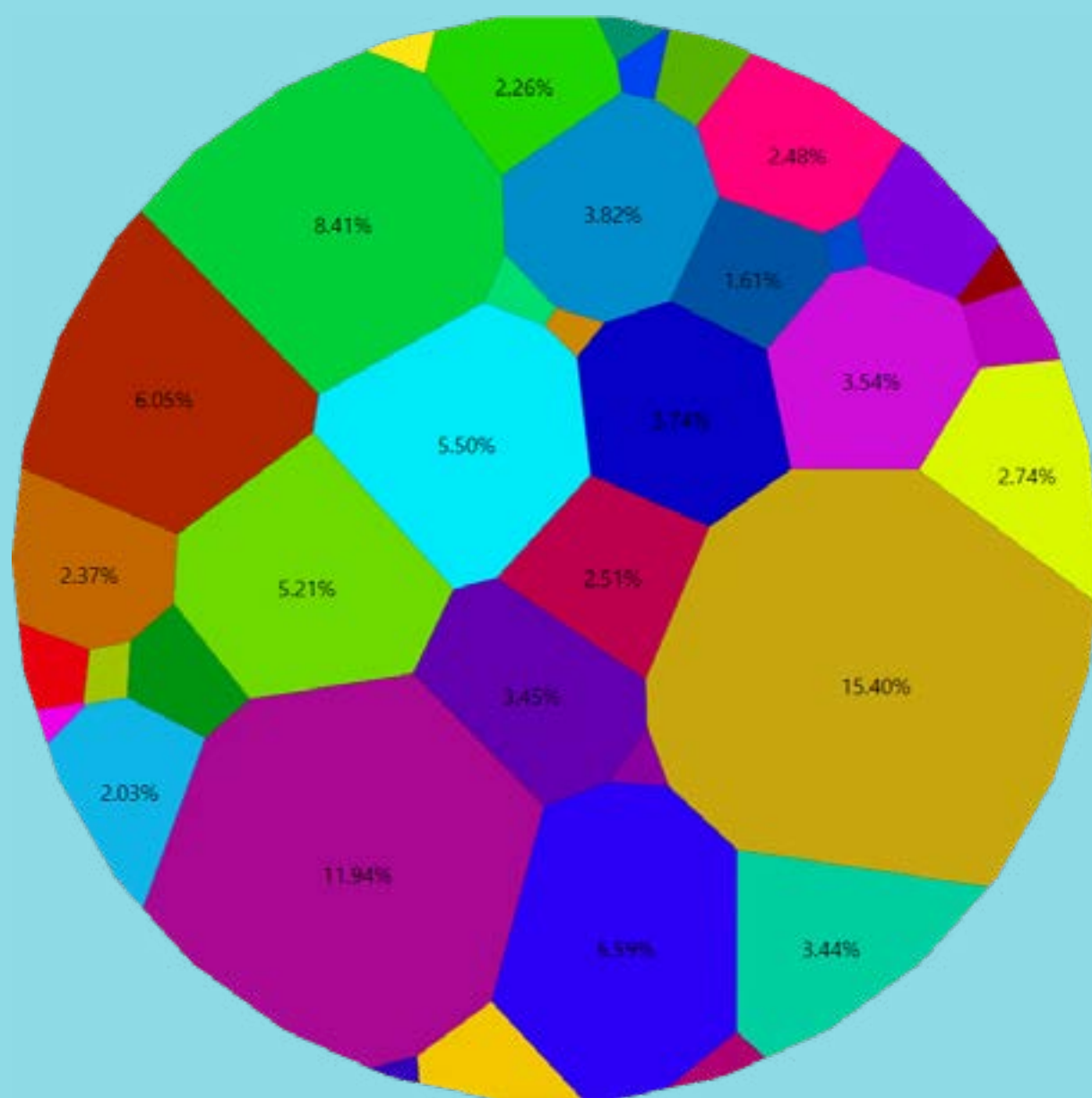


Percentage Share of Procurement Spend - of 31 States & UTs using GePNIC®

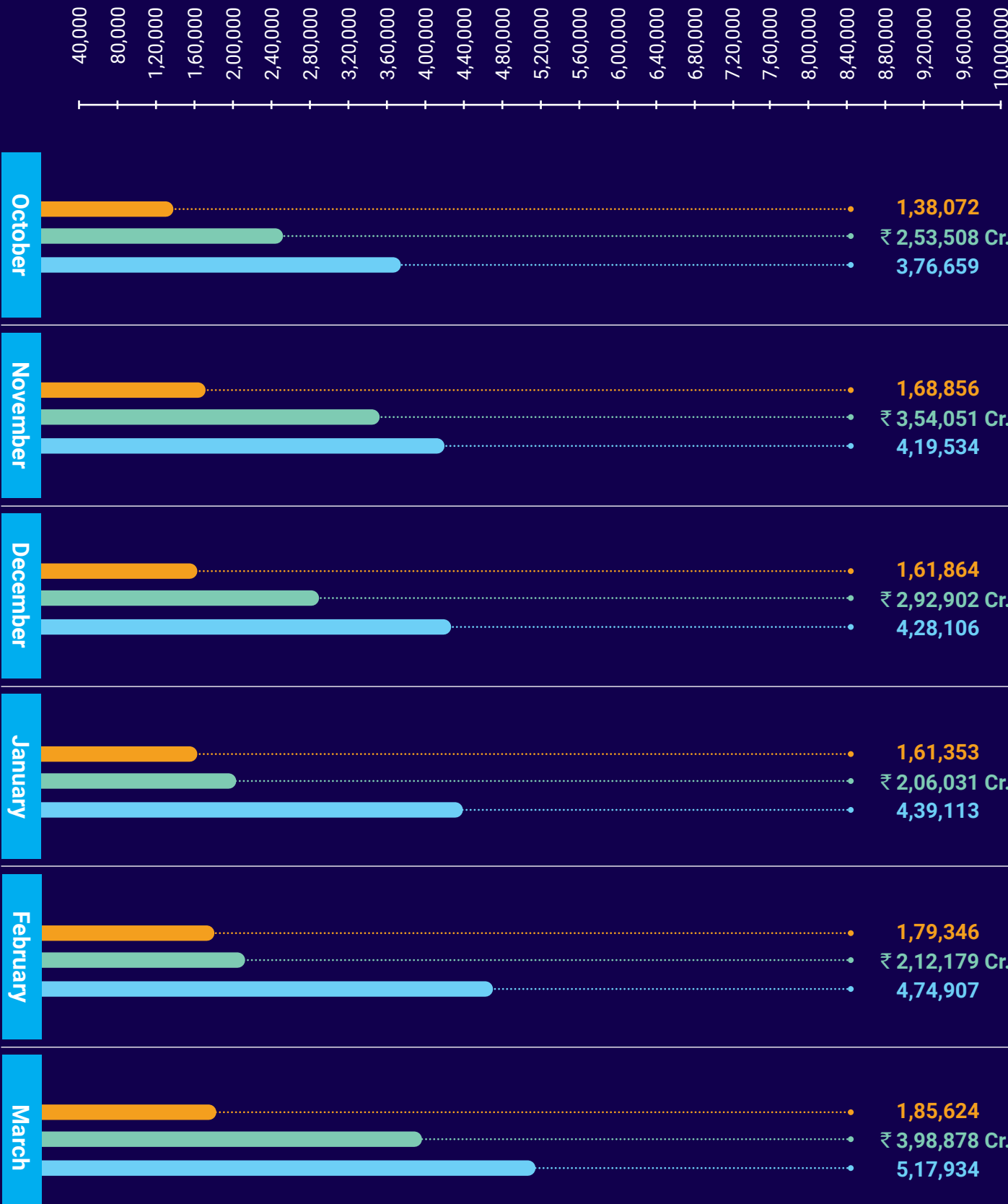
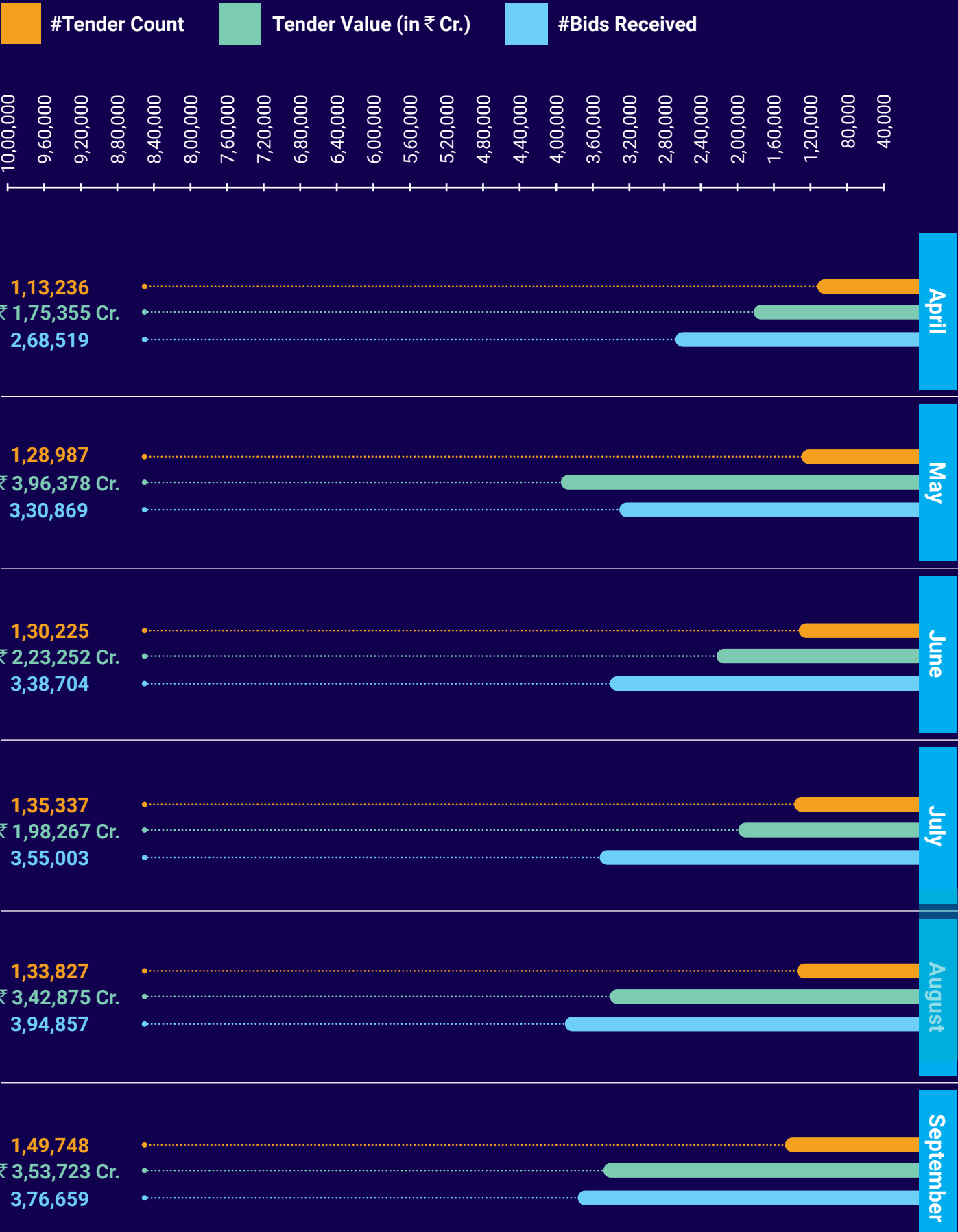

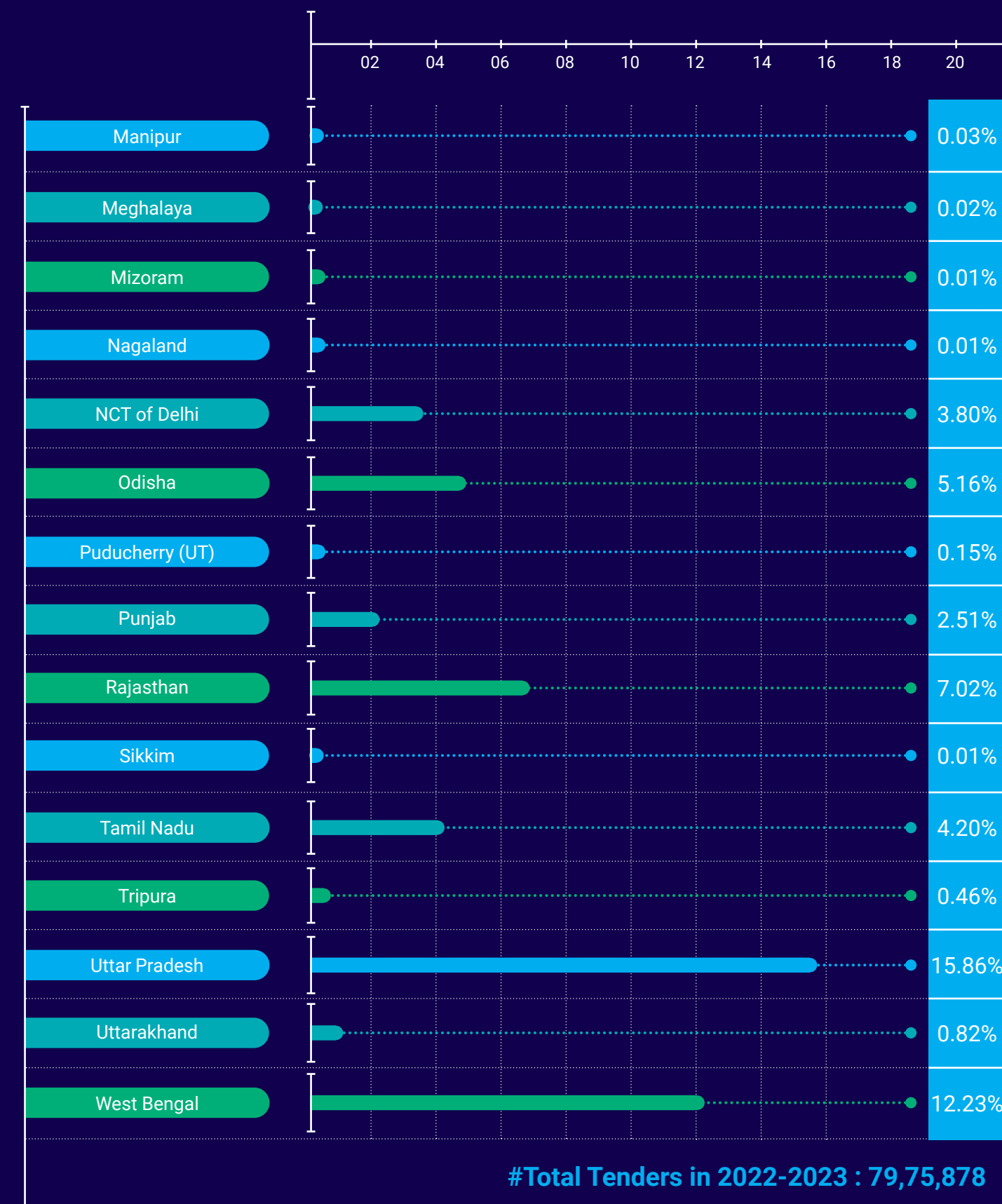
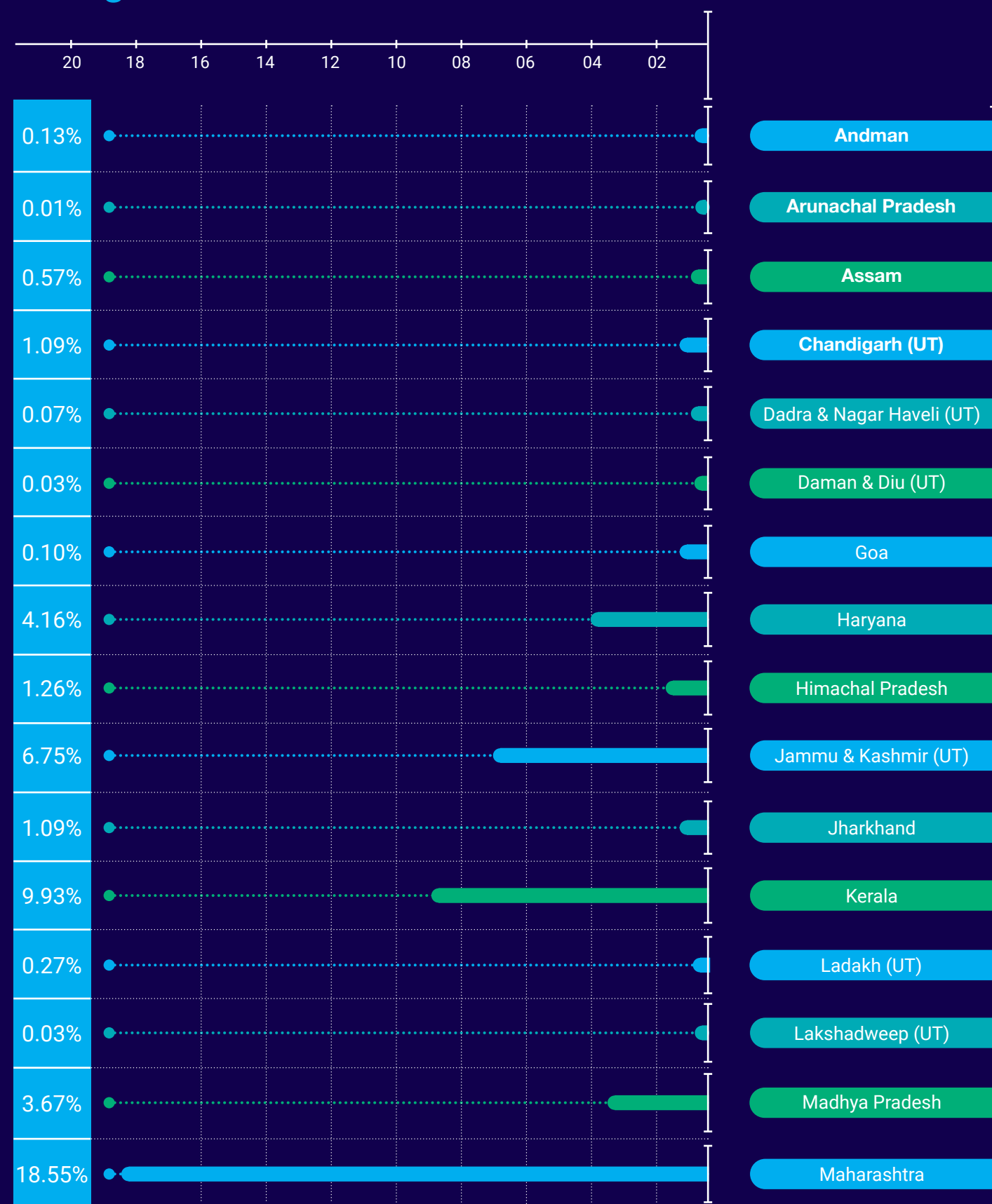

Amendment to General Financial Rules 2017 to include stagewise return of Bid Security / Earnest Money Deposit to bidders in the tendering process

dated 1st April 2022 - It has been decided to partially amend Rule 170(ii) of General Financial Rules (GFR), 2017 regarding 'Return of Bid Security' as under:

'Bid securities of the unsuccessful bidders should be returned to them at the earliest after expiry of the final bid validity and latest on or before the 3rd day after the award of the contract'.

However, in case of two packet or two stage bidding, Bid securities of unsuccessful bidders during first stage i.e. technical evaluation etc should be returned within 30 days of declaration of result of first stage i.e. technical evaluation etc.

Relaxation on Global Tender Enquiry under Rule 161 iv of General Financial Rules for procurement of Medical Devices

dated 21st June 2022 – Amendment in Rule 161(iv) of General Financial Rules (GFRs) 2017 stipulating that no Global Tender Enquiry (GTE) shall be invited for tenders upto ₹ 200 crore. It further stipulates that in exceptional cases, where the Ministry or the Department feels that there are special reasons for GTE, it may record its detailed justification and seek prior approval for relaxation to the above rule from the competent authority i.e Secretary (Coordination), Cabinet Secretariat.

On the request of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoH&FW), 128 medical devices were exempted; by this department vide OM No. 41112021-PPD dated 06th January 2022, from the above instructions. In view of request of MoH&FW, it has now been decided that in supersession of earlier instructions,

now 371 Medical Devices/ Equipment listed at Annexure-A of the order will be exempted from the instructions issued by this department vide OMs No. F.12/17/2019-PPD dated 15th May 2020 & 28th May 2020 regarding GTEs. This exemption will be valid for all the tenders issued after this date for such items till 31st March 2023.

Amendment in General Financial Rules 2017 - Acceptance of electronic Bank Guarantee

dated 5th August 2022 - It has been decided to partially amend Rule 170(i) and Rule 171(i) of General Financial Rules (GFR), 2017 regarding 'Bid Security and Performance Security respectively' as under:

Rule/Para 170(i)

'The bid security may be accepted in the form of Insurance Surety



Bonds, Account Payee Demand Draft, Fixed Deposit Receipt, Banker's Cheque or Bank Guarantee (including e-Bank Guarantee) from any of the Commercial Banks or payment online in an acceptable form, safeguarding the purchaser's interest in all respects.'

Rule/Para 171(i)

'Performance Security may be furnished in the form of Insurance Surety Bonds, Account Payee Demand Draft, Fixed Deposit Receipt from a Commercial Bank, Bank Guarantee (including e- Bank Guarantee) from a Commercial Bank or online payment in an acceptable form safeguarding the purchaser's interest in all respects.'

Relaxation on Global Tender Enquiry (GTE) under Rule 161(iv) of General Financial Rules (GFRs) 2017- relaxation of 90 drug/medicines reg. dated 25th November 2022 – Amendment in Rule 161(iv) of General Financial Rules (GFRs) 2017 stipulating that no Global

Tender Enquiry (GTE) shall be invited for tenders upto Rs. 200 crore or such limit as may be prescribed by this department from time to time, without prior approval from the competent authority i.e. Secretary (Coordination), Cabinet Secretariat.

In this context, in view of request of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoH&FW), 90 Drugs/ Medicines listed at Annexure - A will be exempted from the instructions issued by this department vide OMs No. F.12/17/2019-PPD dated 15th May 2020 & 28th May 2020 regarding GTEs. This exemption will be valid for all the tenders issued for such drugs/ medicines till 31st March 2023.

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, Department of Expenditure

may, by order in writing, impose restrictions, including prior registration and/or screening, on procurement from bidders from, or bidders having commercial arrangements with an entity from, a country or countries, or a class of countries, on grounds of defence of India, or matters directly or indirectly related thereto including national security; no procurement shall be made in violation of such restrictions.

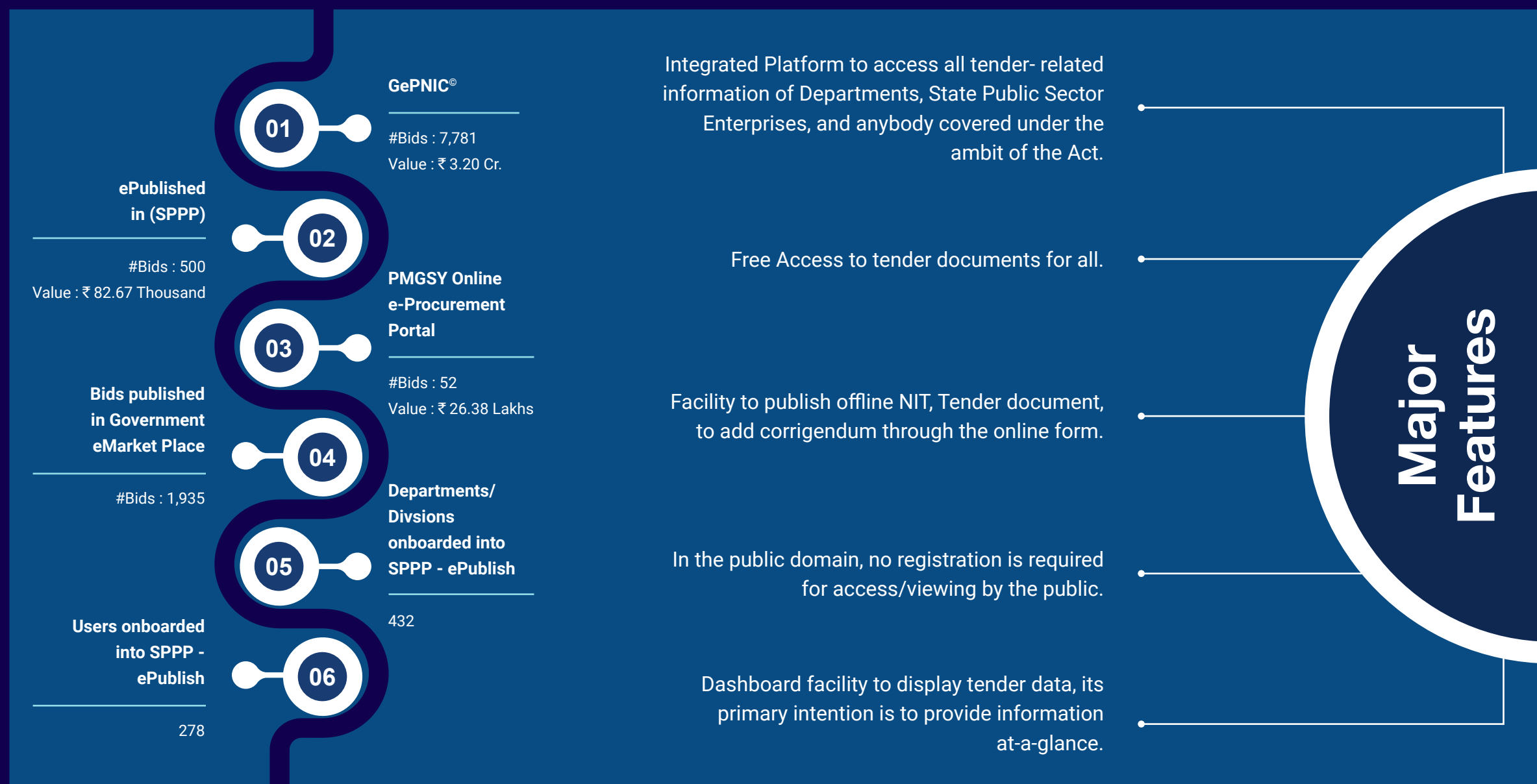

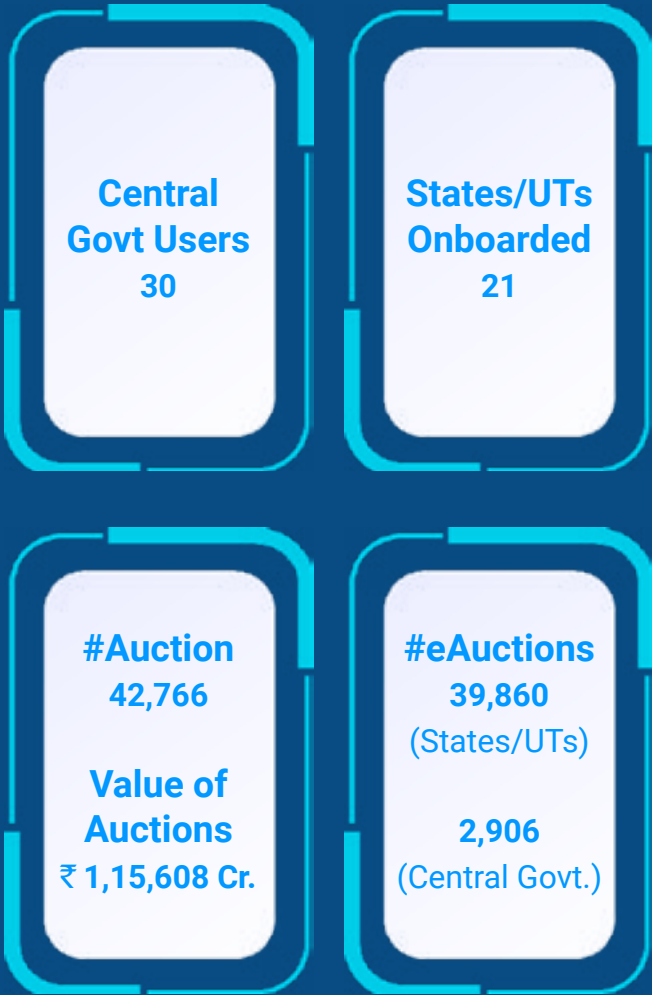

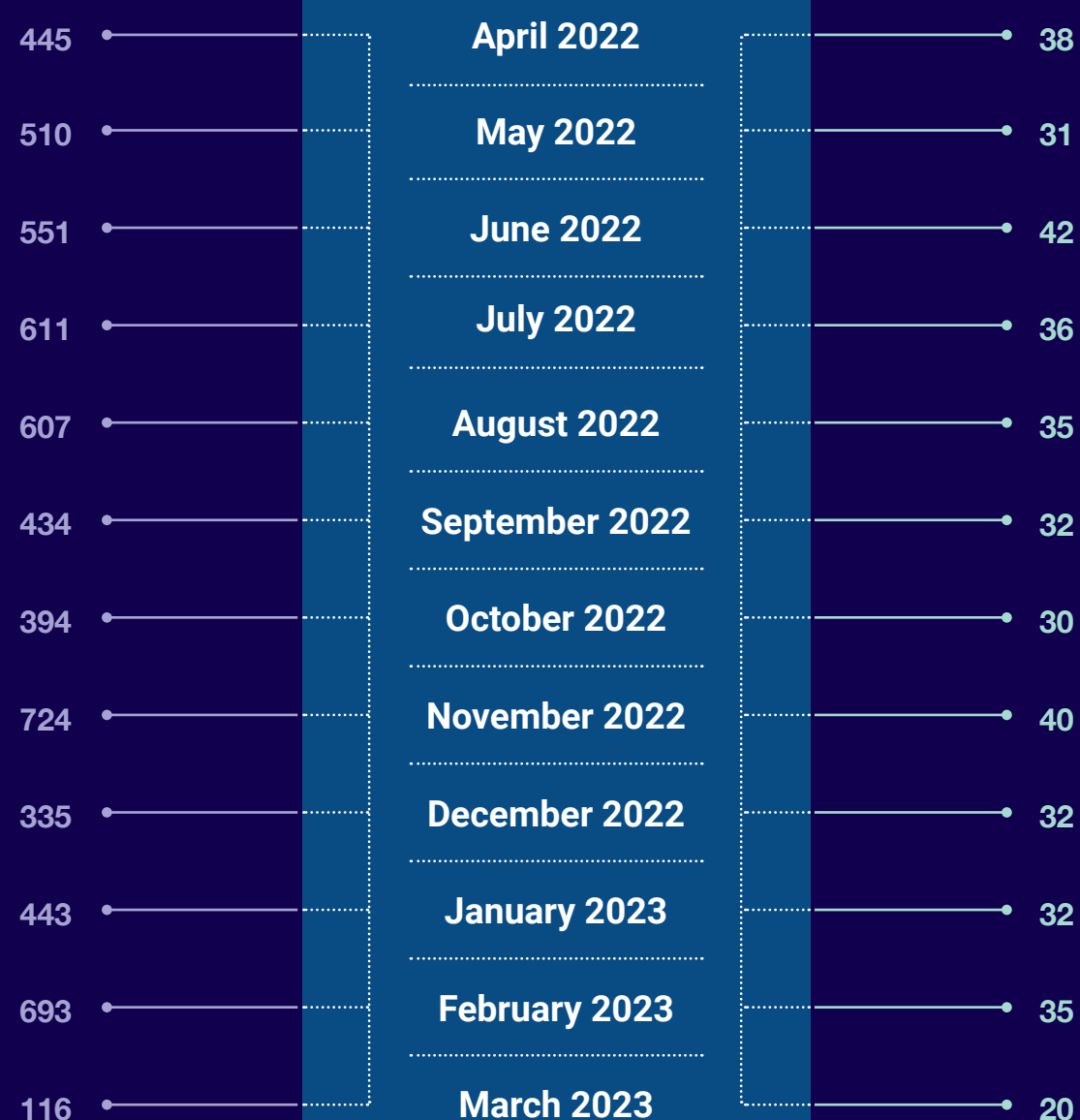
